



New Hampshire Education Tour – 4 days

New Hampshire has many wonderful places to explore! Below are suggested ideas for your groups.

Day 1

Drive North to Concord to delve into the worlds of astronomy, aviation, earth and space sciences at the [McAuliffe-Shepard Discovery Center](#).

Tour the [New Hampshire State House](#) in Concord, the only state house in the country that still uses its original chambers from 1818.

Catch a play at the historic [Palace Theatre](#) or watch a show at the [Capital Center for the Arts](#) or the [Red Rivers Theatre](#).

Day 2

Drive North to [Canterbury Shaker Village](#), the national historic landmark and museum in Canterbury. Take a tour, eat a Shaker lunch and participate in a basket weaving class.

Continue on to Wolfeboro, the oldest resort town in America, to visit the [Wright Museum](#). Walk through time during 1939 to 1945 and explore a collection of vintage military vehicles.

Hire a local [storyteller](#) to perform to your group after diner.

Day 3

Wake up and enjoy breakfast at [Kellerhaus](#), a tradition since 1906. Save time to pick up some homemade candies.

Spend the morning at the [Squam Lakes Natural Science Center](#) in Holderness. Walk the trails, take a lake cruise and enjoy the beauty of Kirkwood Gardens.

Continue to the [Loon Center](#) at the Markus Wildlife Sanctuary in Moultonborough Falls. Spy on nesting loons while hiking on the shore of Lake Winnepesaukee.

Day 4

Head to the [Seacoast Science Center](#) at Odiorne State Park in Rye to discover the natural treasures and rich history of coastal New Hampshire.

Visit the [Urban Forestry Center](#), a wonderful tree farm with educational exhibits, programs, and trails.

Visit one of the [Granite State's orchards and PYO](#). Enjoy fresh baked cider donuts and other locally made goodies. Applecrest Farm Orchards is a year-round apple orchard. It is considered the oldest and largest apple orchard in the state of New Hampshire and the oldest continuously operated apple orchard in the United States.
