

1. Fright Kingdom

Fright Kingdom is the largest indoor haunted attraction in New England. The 65,000 square foot attraction hosts three indoor haunted houses including the insanely twisted 3D Carnival of Corpses, a Vampire Castle and the Victorian Themed Bloodmare Manor. The unique level of detail with movie quality sets, costumes and makeup make this attraction terrifically terrifying.

2. The Ghoulog

Cranmore Mountain is bringing back the Ghoulog for its eighth season this year. Enter into the Mercer Home for the Criminally Insane, an hour-long experience that will lead you through a series of scary mazes, dark rooms and unknown places, and then moves outdoors for an even more terrifying and surprise! Explore the Haunted Playground which features the Giant Swing, Soaring Eagle Zipline and the Mountain Coaster all in unique night-time lighting. The occasional ghost or ghoul are bound to surprise you when you least expect it.

3. Haunted Acres

Located at Liquid Planet Waterpark, step into "Area 52" and experience five exciting haunts. Take your chances along the Quarter Mile Nightmare Walk, and hope you don't get stopped by the deranged residents of Area 52. Explore the Graveyard of the Damned, the Maze from Hell, the 3D Nuclear Accident House and Cell Block 13 for terrifying scares. Haunted Acres is also home to New England's only nighttime 1,000 foot Haunted Zipline.

4. Haunted Overload

Journey (if you dare) into the last standing remains of an old farming village. Dark things once happened here, so dark that no one wants to remember the village even existed. Located at Demeritt Hill Farm, Haunted Overload offers a unique and terrifying experience with handmade sets, gigantic monsters, original costumes, and spooky light and sound effects. Venture into the haunted woods to explore the remnants of what was once a normal village, but beware, some things may have never left.



5. Harvest of Haunts

Charmingfare Farm pulls out all the stops with their four haunting attractions, but will you survive the harvesting? Travel down dark and twisting roads into even darker woods on the Wagon of Fear. Watch your head as you enter the Barn of the Dead, and hope that none of the farm tools fall down on you. Hop aboard the tractor for a Ride into the Bog, or take your chances in the Infested Corn Field.

6. Morbid Mountain

There are many urban legends about what this mountain was used for before it came to be Gunstock Mountain Resort. Tour the EXECush Inn, where a couple on their honeymoon is in for the surprise of their life! Later, take your chances in the Forest of Fear, where unexplained things happen in the woods at night. If you've made it through the terrors of Morbid Mountain, head over to the blackout area to find out what's lurking in the shadows.

7. Nightmare New England

Presented by Spookyworld, Nightmare New England is the largest haunted destination in the Northeast. Located at Mel's Funway Park, it is home to five separate attractions that are all equally guaranteed to make you scream. There is something for everyone with zombie paintball, live entertainment, go-karts, mini-golf, carnival concessions, batting cages, tarot card readers and fire pits.



8. ScreeemFest
