



New Hampshire Rail, Sale and Cruise Tour - 4 days

Scenic trains and cruises are a major part of New Hampshire's history and made New Hampshire the United State's first vacation destination by bringing wealthy families north from Boston in the mid 1800's. Day 1

Get started on this tour with shopping at the **<u>Settlers Green</u>** outlets.

Head up the road to the **Conway Scenic Railroad** for a scenic afternoon train ride on the Mounaineer to Crawford Notch.

Return to **North Conway Village** and peruse the boutique shops while eating a late lunch at one of the many cafés.

End the first day by throwing a private kick-off party with live entertainment **Moat Mountain Brewery** located minutes from the village.

Day 2

Start the morning in Littleton's downtown area. Home to local shops, galleries, and eateries.

Lunch will be at the **Omni Mount Washington Resort**. Following lunch, you will take an exclusive tour of the Resort.

In the afternoon, just 10 minutes away, the group will ride the first ever mountain climbing tracks in the world on the **Mount Washington Cog Railway**.

Day 3

Wake up early and take the <u>Kancamagus Highway</u> through the White Mountain National Forest to Lincoln.

Head straight to the **<u>Hobo Railroad</u>** to see the Flying Yankee restoration, famous for its part in America's history during the Great Depression and World War II.

After the tour, head to <u>Clark's Trading Post</u> for a delicious home-cooked private lunch followed by a ride on the White Mountain Central Railroad. Ride their steam engine through the only remaining, Howe-Truss Covered Bridge in the world. If you need a train break, watch their famous black bear show instead.

Explore the shops and easy walking trails in **downtown North Woodstock**.



Have a gourmet dining experience aboard the relaxing **Cafe Lafayette Dinner Train**.

Day 4

Head south on Route 16 to the Lakes Region and stop at the <u>Tanger Outlets</u> and the Moultonborough Country Store. This is possibly the oldest country store in the United States, first opening in 1781.

Arrive in Meredith for a couple hours of shopping at the Mill Falls Marketplace.

Have lunch aboard the Winnipesaukee Railroad starting at Meredith Station to Laconia.

From Laconia's Docks cruise aboard the <u>US Mailboat Sophie C</u>. The U.S. Mailboat navigates smaller channels and waterways to provide postal service to the island residents of Lake Winnipesaukee. On each trip she'll visit several different islands, and the Skipper will point out areas of interest along the way.
