



The goal of this contest is to provide an educational, team-building project for 4th grade students in which they can enjoy the creative challenge of condensing their message into a 60-second time frame.

TIMING

All videos must be received by the NH Division of Travel and Tourism by February 16, 2017 by 4:00 PM.

ENTRY

Go to visitnh.gov/classactvideoawards to complete the application and Model Release Forms. These forms must be received by February 16, 2017, with the video, to be eligible to participate. Teachers must also include a completed **Entry Form** and **Model Release Form**. Any student participating on film, speaking or acting, must complete a Model Release Form. Any student not seen or heard on the video does not need to fill out a Model Release Form. Teachers are responsible for ensuring participation in this contest is approved by the student's parent or guardian.

PRIZES

Winners will be provided with instructions on how to redeem their prize following the public announcement. It is the responsibility of the teacher to coordinate directly with the prize sponsors.

FORMAT

Videos in WebM file, MPEG4, 3GPP, MOV, AVI, MPEGPS, WMV or FIV format can be uploaded to the contest landing page.



PARTICIPATION

Only one video is permitted per individual 4th grade class. Individual 4th grade class is defined as one classroom and not the entire 4th grade student body. Video cannot exceed 60 seconds. Video credits can be included and can exceed the 60-second requirement. Please be sure that the class' topic of choice and video is appropriate and does not include any offensive, racial, sexual and/or religious content. Any video containing inappropriate content will not qualify. Teachers must supervise class creation of the video and may assist where needed.
